

Discipleship Leader Self-Evaluation

(For Small Group Leaders)



Below are a few indicators that will help you evaluate how you are doing in some of the areas necessary to be a good Disciple Leader. It should also be helpful in understanding the areas that you can work on. Please check the ones you feel you are doing well.

Faithful

- you are committed to regular daily prayer
- you attend Mass on Sundays
- you are faithful to ALL Church teaching (*does not mean you necessarily know and understand all Church teachings*)
- you receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation on a regular basis
- you are obedient and respectful of the parish youth coordinator, parish priest(s), and the Bishop of the Diocese
- you have completed all Safe Environment requirements

Contagious

- you are creating a culture in your group that is exciting and engaging for the youth involved
- you are joyful about the faith (*ask your neighbor if you are not sure!*)
- you often are inviting others to participate in the different ministries and events in the parish
- you find yourself teaching others about Discipleship
- you are regularly connecting with others in the parish and community about the mission of Discipleship
- you are consistently working on the relationship you have with the parents of the youth that you are working with

Available

- you are committed to regular meetings with your Discipleship group
- you are committed to regular training and fellowship with other Discipleship leaders
- you communicate well with the youth, parents, and the parish youth coordinator
- you plan and prepare adequately for discipleship meetings and parish events
- you are available to youth outside of regular meetings
- you make an effort to connect and minister to the youth in your group outside of regular meeting times

Teachable

- you have a good understanding of the vision of the parish and strive to follow it
- you respond well to direction from your parish youth coordinator and advice from fellow adult leaders
- you and your co-leader have a good working relationship where you are learning and growing with each other
- you are involved in the planning and vision of the formation of the youth in your group and are always looking for new ideas
- you respond well to criticism from parents and others in the parish
- you are growing spiritually
